OUR SCHOOL ENVIRONMENT

Our focus at Idaho City High School is to consistently challenge students academically in a supportive, nurturing environment. We strongly encourage our students to continue their education beyond the secondary level whether it is at a university, community college, vocational, technical institution or through an approved apprenticeship program. To that end we require all our students to develop a career plan as incoming ninth graders. Additionally, all students must have three years of both Science and Math at the high school level in order to graduate.

We place a strong emphasis on building individual relationships with our students. In the classrooms and through our PRIDE (7-12 character education) program teachers reach out to students, and students to each other, to build a sense of ownership, worth and belonging. We have a great group people and a staff that is committed to helping them achieve their goals.
